Thank you for your Freedom of Information request received on 21 August 2019. You asked for: -

“... I am writing a paper on how the Money Advice Service has changed since Treasury called for it to be closed in 2016. However, I can't find anywhere on your site how you get paid. Could you please supply me with this information, and where it is on your site? I believe this is a part of the FCA guidelines for financial management companies”.

Money Advice Service has two primary work streams: Money Guidance and Debt Advice. Both are funded by the levy on regulated firms. The Financial Conduct Authority (FCA) raises and collects this levy on behalf of Money Advice Service. The information is in the public domain, you can find more information here:
