Thank you for your Freedom of Information request received on 25th May 2021 concerning the allocation of the Debt Advice Levy Awards for 2019-2021.

You asked the Money and Pensions Service the following:

"This is a request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000. I hereby request the following: A breakdown of Funding Awarded in respect of the Debt Advice Levy to organisations, companies, and individuals (where applicable). Please confirm the total annual award, by Recipient for the financial years 2019/20 and 2020/21."

Money and Pensions Service Response:

I am writing to confirm that we have now completed a search for the information you requested. The Money and Pensions Service (MaPS) does hold information relevant to your request, and I have responded to your points accordingly. Additionally, some of the information within the scope of your request is exempt under the Freedom of Information Act.

MaPS provides Debt Advice which is funded by the Financial Services Levy. In 2019/20 it provided £43.93m in total across the following organisations and initiatives: CITA Innovations, StepChange, Money Advice Trust, CITA Knowsley, Toynbee Hall, Talking Money, Community Advice Law Service, and PACE - Pilot of Adviser Capacity and Efficiency. The PACE component was funded through Citizens Advice, StepChange, and the Money Advice Trust.

MaPS aims to publish a comprehensive report of its annual accounts for 2020/21 shortly. The details are currently being reviewed but will be available on MaPS website at which point a breakdown can be provided upon request. For this reason, this information is exempt under Section 22 which covers information intended for future publication.
